



Director of Development & Education in Perioperative Medicine and Intensive Care at Karolinska University Hospital



To get to Karolinska University Hospital from Arlanda Airport:

Option A, Airport buses:

To and from Arlanda airport, you can take the airport buses. They go to Stockholm Central Station and takes approximately 45 minutes. For tickets and information, <u>click here</u>.

From the Central Station, you can take the subway (green line) to Odenplan station and take buss number 6 or 507, and stop at 'Karolinska sjukhuset Eugeniavägen (Solna)'.

Or go one station further to St:Eriksplan station (green line), and opt for busses 3 or 77, and stop at 'Karolinska sjukhuset Eugeniavägen (Solna)'.






Elite Hotel Carolina Tower


